MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

Jesus is the light of the world against evil



The previous Advent season takes us from what was coming to what has arrived... to what is spreading into every corner, brings us to this central wonder: *the angelic announcement that love has come. God in Christ has been placed in creation's arms to worship, to adore, to ponder. Love is present,*

not in theory, but in an actual child, a human being born with a specific history.

The gorgeous consequence of such a birth is that we can see God's presence in real things. Dare we even announce the radical notion that God is fully present in all things, in all people, and in all of life?

In an ideal world, we would have lots of time to revel in these twelve days of Christmas. For most people, however, Christmas is over in the first three days. Our task is to help shift our focus back to the full extent of the season of Christmas, meaning we announce that this is precisely the time when Christ is born.

John's incarnational read of the Jesus story often serves as the primary lens for grasping Luke's beautiful, and more prominent, story. **Luke** places the story in the complex Roman occupation of Galilee and Judah. Luke pits

God's presence against the autocrat and economies of empire, exploitation, and greed. *These are familiar themes in our own times!*

God's arrival and the tragic reality of the world come together on the first Sunday of Christmas as we hear the lament of Rachel and all mothers of murdered children, caught in the crossfire of power and violence.

In this season, we hear from three gospel writers, each with a different Christmas gift to unwrap for the sharing of our stories. For **Matthew**, the holy family are *refugees*. Joseph follows his *dreams*. The family comes home to Galilee. Matthew invokes another exodus, a liberating journey under the care of angelic guides, to another promised land.

Despite the gruesome and terrible power of Herod, *he is outwitted by dreamers, dedicated faithfulness, and God's fierce determination to bring home the lost*. We cannot avoid the harsh realities of life, but we can name them as forces that cannot win.

The power of the baby Jesus, whether in the manger or in the house that welcomes the mysterious magi, is the good news that ends one year and begins another.

How beautiful ... are the feet of the Messenger who announces peace, brings good news, and announces salvation! (Isa. 52:7). Amen
